In response to Covid-19 restrictions, Meals on Wheels OC modified the Lunch Café Program to the Grab and Go Meals Program.

- Frozen microwavable meals are available for pick-up at Fullerton Community Center on Tuesdays 11:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.
- Meals are planned and certified by our registered dietician to meet daily nutritional federal guidelines.
- Grab and Go Meals sites will safely transition back to Lunch Café Programs and adhere to Covid-19 safety protocols.

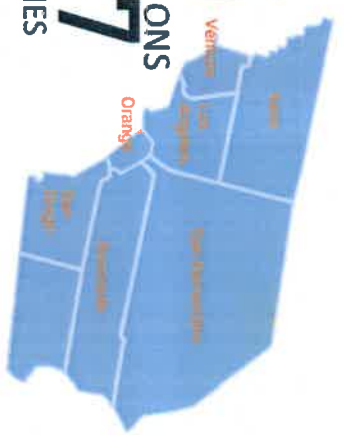

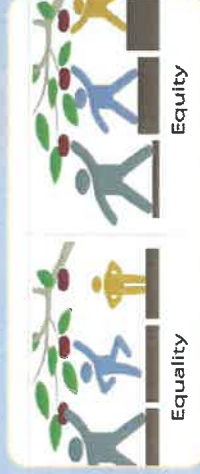
Project Need



This project will address the need for public services for moderate- to low-income residents.



This project addresses disparities faced by the BIPOC population and low-income families in access to autism diagnoses, service and supports, and the quality of services, when compared to other Americans.



Stats

- 1 in 44 children diagnosed with autism in US
- 1 in 26 children diagnosed with autism in CA
- Autism is prevalent in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups
- BIPOC children less likely to receive autism diagnosis or receive diagnosis at a later age
- Delays in diagnosis can require longer and more intensive intervention

Project Proposal



ESSC will provide autism services and outreach and education to the Fullerton community

- Autism services: ABA, Speech, OT, PT
- Outreach and education
- Outreach at community events, including resource fairs
- Education: developmental milestones, signs of autism, diagnosis, treatments, resources for older children, transition resources

Early identification and treatment is key to starting a child and family down the path toward skill development and tools to mitigate challenges

Project Goals

Goal:
Provide 50 unduplicated Fullerton residents with direct autism services (Applied Behavior Analysis, Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, Physical Therapy).

Objective: Increase education and awareness about autism diagnosis, resources, and treatments.

Objective: Provide outreach information for access to health and social care services at resource fairs and community events.

Food insecurity is the first need met in order to chart a path to building personal capacity and self-sufficiency



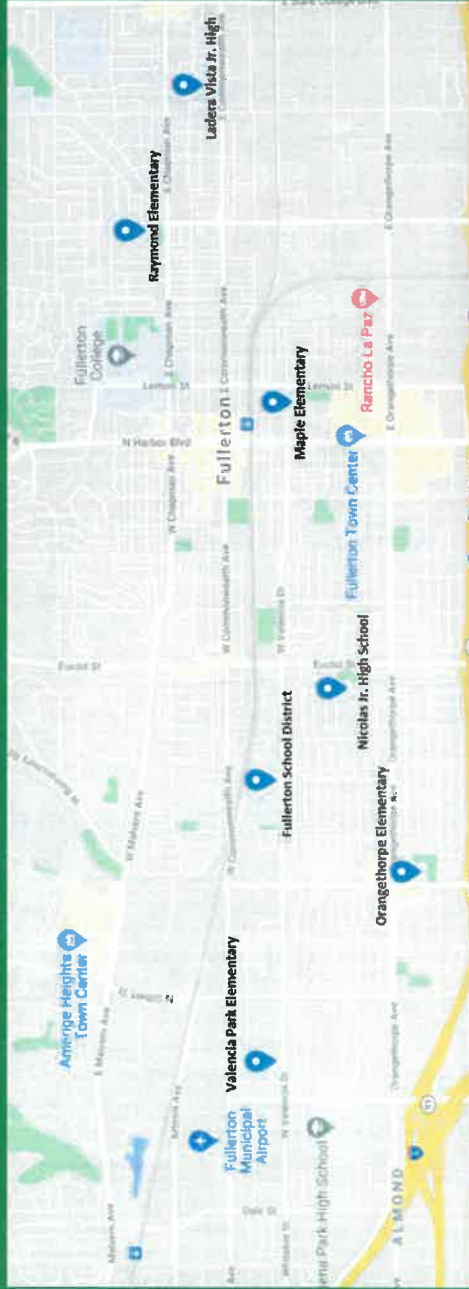
Currently serving 1,122 families in Orange County, Los Angeles County, and San Bernardino County

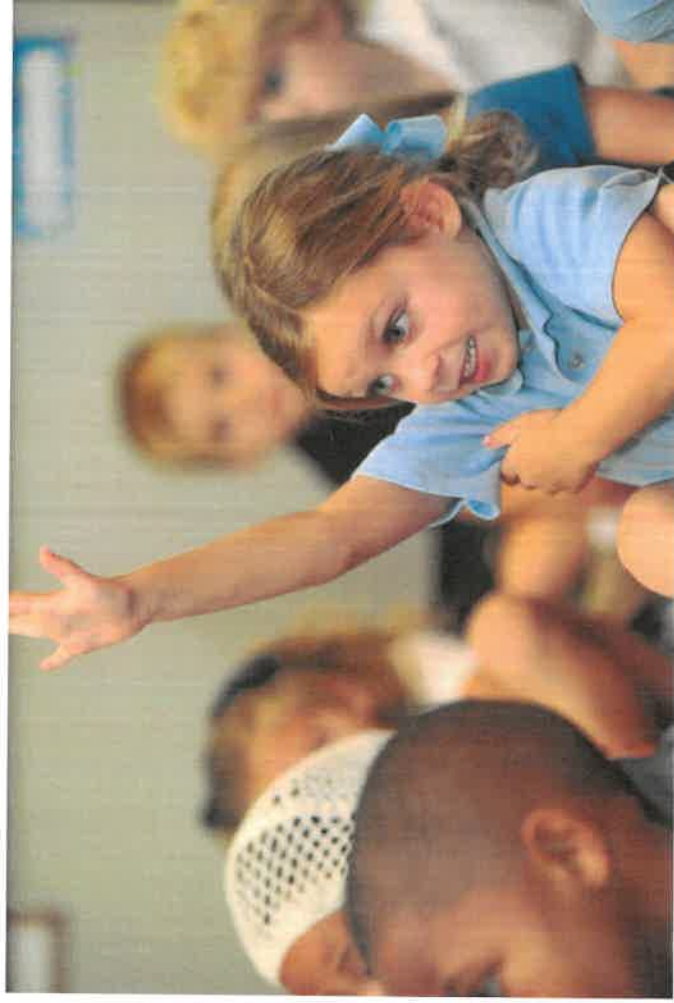

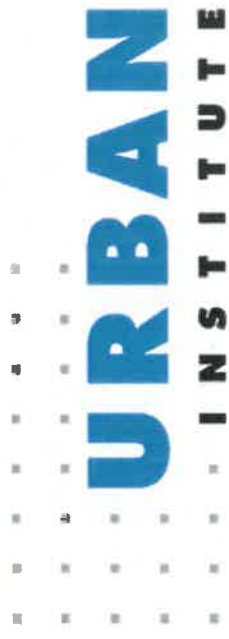

FHF is a bonafide Fair Housing Organization and offers a comprehensive Fair Housing Program that meets the HUD requirement for Affirmatively Further Fair Housing.

Our Fair Housing Program is broken down into 4 important components:

1. Fair Housing and Discrimination, Investigations, and Resolution:

- Counsel allegations of housing discrimination, open intakes of the allegations, and conduct investigation and testing to uncover whether there is evidence of discrimination.





2. Tenant and Landlord Counseling:

- Provide practical and accurate information and guidance to landlords and tenants based on their rights and responsibilities. Provide mediations, assist tenants with answering unlawful detainers, and provide effective referrals for unresolved complaints.

3. Education and Outreach Activities:

- We educate tenants, landlords, owners, and property management companies on fair housing laws and promote consumer awareness.
- These include the staffing of booths, conducting Fair Housing workshops (Virtual/In-Person), providing presentations, attending community meetings, walk-in clinics, PSAs, and literature distribution throughout the city. All education and outreach activities are conducted within the City limits.

4. Affirmatively Further Fair Housing Activities:

- Assist cities in reporting their efforts to Affirmatively Further Fair Housing (AFFH), plan and implement activities, conduct audits and programs to address the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice.
