

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-XXX

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FULLERTON,
CALIFORNIA DETERMINING THE FULLERTON WELL 10 PFAS WATER
TREATMENT PROJECT EXEMPT FROM THE CALIFORNIA
ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT

WHEREAS, the City of Fullerton determined a treatment plant for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) is required to reduce concentrations in drinking water extracted from the groundwater basin at the existing Main Plant well site.

WHEREAS, City of Fullerton, in its capacity under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), evaluated the potential for environmental impacts associated with the City of Fullerton Well 10 PFAS Water Treatment Project (Project).

WHEREAS, such evaluation determined the Project is consistent with the applicable Categorical Exemption (Class 3, Section 15303) under the CEQA Guidelines as it would consist of the construction and operation of a small treatment plant at a previously disturbed site representing development of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures and it would not result in any significant impacts to the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FULLERTON RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

1. City Council incorporates the preceding recitals by reference.
2. The Fullerton Well 10 PFAS Water Treatment Project is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15303 because it consists of construction and operation of a small treatment plant at a previously disturbed site representing development of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures and would not result in any significant impacts to the environment.
