#### **Electrical Maintenance Permit**

A fee of \$ 175.64 shall be paid for each annual Industrial Maintenance Electrical Permit issued for the maintenance and continued operation of previously-approved electrical systems involved in the industrial process. Such permit shall be valid for a period of six months, and authorizes the replacement of existing components of the industrial process with like components. At the end of the six-month period, an itemized list of the replaced components shall be submitted to the Building Official, and fees based upon the work done, as itemized in the fee schedule, shall be paid. All replacement parts and equipment shall be inspected, and upon approval, the maintenance permit finalized. This permit does not authorize the installation of any new equipment, except as replacement only, or any other type of modification to the electrical system.

7. Pursuant to Section 14.05.050 of the Fullerton Municipal Code, the Plan Review Fees shall be as follows:

#### **ELECTRICAL**
