Programming

Hunt Branch Library has four recurring programs being hosted which are well and regularly attended with consistent and growing attendance:

- Musical Wednesdays from 1:30-2:30pm every 1st & 3rd Wednesdays of the Month (All ages but best enjoyed by those in 1st grade and up)
- Crafternoon from 3-4pm every 2nd and 4th Thursdays (All ages)
- o Gameday @ The Hunt from 9am-3pm every 3rd Saturday of the month (All Ages)
- Class Visits including activities and literacy-based programs in partnership with Parks & Recreation staff. The class visits last about 2 hours.

As Hunt Library is situated near a growing population and multiple schools and daycares making sure an adequate and relevant collection is key. A major portion of the collection (especially new titles) was purchased through donations from the Fullerton Main Rotary, Friends of the Library, and the Library Foundation.

Our checkouts largely skew towards the children's collection as seen below. We have had 497 Children's Books checked out and 90 Adult which follows our expectation and collection ratio.
