# FISCAL IMPACT

The Flashing Beacon Pedestrian System Project acceptance generates no additional fiscal impact. The City completed the in FY 2023-24 and Caltrans requires accepting project completion to close out project.

#### BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

The City received \$422,800 in federal funding through the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) competitive grant program in 2018. The City utilized only \$216,831.91 for the Flashing Beacon Pedestrian System Project Due to final project scope amendment. Staff used these funds to offset construction costs and completed and accepted the project on October 19, 2023.

The Department of Transportation (Caltrans) Local Assistance Procedures Manual (LAPM) requires the City formally accept the Flashing Beacon Pedestrian System Project completion to close out the project and receive the awarded federal grant funding.

City staff requests City Council accept the Flashing Beacon Pedestrian System Project as complete. This approval would allow staff to submit federal funding documentation, including the Final Report of Expenditures (FROE) in accordance with Local Assistance Procedures Manual (LAPM) Chapter 17.
