


Our City Council recently extended the Walk-on-Wilshire closure to January 31, 2025 and directed staff to review the feasibility of a full street closure (Malden to Harbor; see below). RE: Resolution No. 2024-XXX. Walk on Wilshire pilot program

Pursuant to your request, this letter is to provide the City of Fullerton (City) with information regarding impacts to the natural gas infrastructure as it evaluates the feasibility of permanently closing 200' of segment on Wilshire Ave., between Malden Ave. and N. Harbor Blvd., as pictured in the attachment hereto (the Affected Area).

Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) currently transmits and distributes gas to its customers located within the City's limits pursuant to that certain franchise agreement (City ordinance No. 463) between it and the City, dated January 3, 1939 (Franchise). Based on SoCalGas' limited review, none of our currently existing natural gas infrastructure appear to be impacted by a permanent closure of the Affected Area provided the Affected Area remains part of the public right of way. However, as a regulated public utility under the jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), SoCalGas maintains its obligation to serve customers if requested in the future. Furthermore, Section 8 of the Franchise states, "[t]he grantee of this franchise shall construct, install and maintain all pipes and appurtenances in accordance with and in conformity with all of the ordinance's rules and regulations heretofore and hereafter adopted by the legislative body of this City."

Beyond this corridor, underground natural gas infrastructure has been identified throughout the City, wherein SoCalGas is responsible for maintaining and operating its pipelines and appurtenances in accordance with state and federal laws. Therefore, adequate access shall be maintained at all times to such facilities. If permanent or semi-permanent fixtures are installed, such as furnishings or infrastructure adjacent to or above utility infrastructure, all elements are subject to removal when SoCalGas requires access. It should be noted that SoCalGas' costs incurred in connection with the removal or repairs will be the sole responsibility of the customer served from the pipeline that has impaired access.





COMMENTS:

After a walk-through of the location, services can be provided with some modifications. If Merchant Farmers Bank will allow Republic to stage our containers in their parking lot as noted in the aerial view (Wilshire option B) We could place the mini pkrs for Wilshire Prom and The Cellar via scout service so that our truck has direct access to the dump without the driver having to perform any backing. The scout driver will then return the containers to their original locations. This can be scheduled early in the morning for less impact on locations.

Another more detailed option would require multiple changes:

- A. 1st parking space on Whiting must be eliminated just before the alley entrance.
- B. The alley is very narrow for trucks, and vehicles coming in opposite directions will not have passing room.
- C. The gate between Merchant Farmers Bank's parking lot and The Cellar needs to be removed so the driver can exit after dumping the bins inside The Cellar.
- D. 1st two parking stalls in The Cellars parking lot need to be removed so the truck has turning access.
- E. Wilshire Prom Apts already has pull-out service but will need to be relocated to a different location, possibly Merchant Farmers Bank or next to The Cellars container.
- F. The driver is concerned about other delivery vehicles in the location when servicing and the very minimal maneuvering room.
