**SUBJECT:** WELL 10 PFAS WATER TREATMENT PROJECT GRANT  
FUNDING AND CEQA EXEMPTION

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### **SUMMARY**

Approve \$4,300,000 State Water Resources Control Board grant submittal, acceptance and execution for the Water Well 10 per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) Water Treatment Project and CEQA project exemption.

**PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT**

**FISCAL IMPACT**

The Orange County Water District (OCWD) is financing the Well 10 PFAS Treatment Plant Project design and construction for the City of Fullerton. The City assists OCWD to obtain grants OCWD may use to fund construction work in accordance with a 2020 Agreement with OCWD. This grant has no financial impact to the City as OCWD would use funding to offset project construction costs.

The project cost totals approximately \$8.6 million with construction costing approximately \$5.6 million. The grant application requests \$4.3 million and, if awarded, would go towards construction costs.

**BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

The City, in addition to other Orange County cities, executed a PFAS Treatment Facilities and Program Agreement (Agreement) with OCWD to address PFAS within the Orange County Groundwater Basin in 2020. The Agreement includes provisions for OCWD to finance treatment facility designs and construction with cities paying future groundwater replenishment assessments to address costs. OCWD financed the Well 10 PFAS Water Treatment Plant Project design and construction scheduled for completion in 2028.

The Agreement states the City will support and assist OCWD in pursuing grants that fund construction work. This grant would minimize future replenishment assessment increases which the City passes through to the customer in City water rates.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law set aside \$5 billion through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) to reduce PFAS and other emerging contaminants exposure. The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) Division of Financial Assistance administers the program in California. The SWRCB provides PFAS Grants as Emerging Contaminant (EC) Principal Forgiveness, up to a maximum \$25,000,000 award per water system. Eligible drinking water projects include new treatment and related facilities construction that address and remove EC and PFAS such as the City Well 10 Treatment Project.

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The City would receive grant funds as owner and operator of the water treatment plant under the grant funding agreement. OCWD would submit invoice(s) to the City for the total grant amount and the City would pay OCWD as “proof of payment” before seeking and receiving reimbursement from SWRCB. The City would serve as a “pass through” agency between SWRCB and OCWD with a net zero financial impact to the City of Fullerton.

The grant application requires the City to adopt a resolution to execute a grant funding agreement with the SWRCB. Attachment 1 contains the draft authorization resolution.

This item also requires exempting the Fullerton Well 10 PFAS Water Treatment Project from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15303. The project is consistent with Categorical Exemption Section 15303 because it constructs pipeline within public street right of way and well rehabilitation would not result in any significant impacts to the environment.
