CITY MANAGER REMARKS

The City Manager recommends approval. The costs for design will remain within the budget allocation. The purchase orders for the firms is to provide flexibility in the utilization of design firms.

PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT

This item matches the following Priority Policy Statement:

Infrastructure and City Assets.

FISCAL IMPACT

City Council approval to enter into professional service agreements with the proposed firms to create an on-call professional engineering services list to utilize on an as needed basis generates no additional fiscal impact. Each FY 2023-24 programmed Capital Improvement Project Budget in various projects and/or from private development plan check fees includes the costs of professional engineering services. The applicable Department annual operating budget may also contain costs from staff augmentation services.

DISCUSSION

The Public Works / Engineering Division solicited for on-call / as-needed professional services for civil engineering discipline services as the existing on-call services contracts expire in October 2023. The City would use these firms to supplement engineering staff for capital improvement project design and private development plan check. These consultants would help meet project schedules without increasing in-house engineering staffing levels. Staff augmentation services would provide as-needed personnel to cover any vacancies and/or additional specialized services (inspection, permitting, public counter, etc.).

The Public Works Department issued Request for Qualification (RFQ) #4391 on April 13, 2023 to solicit Statement of Qualifications (SOQs) from engineering firms for the following areas:

- Civil Engineering Design (CIP)
- Water Engineering Design (CIP)
- Geotechnical Engineering and Material Testing (CIP)

- 3. Reject Guy Construction bid due to non-responsiveness.
- 4. Award \$899,899 construction contract to Vellutini Corporation dba Royal Electric Company for Project 49015 Runway 06 Precision Approach Path Indicator Project and authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute the contract, in a form approved by the City Attorney.
- 5. Authorize Administrative Services Director, or designee, to enter \$42,153 purchase order with C & S Companies, Inc. for professional engineering construction support services for the Runway 6 Precision Approach Path Indicator Project.
- Authorize Public Works Director, or designee, to approve any future change orders for construction and professional engineering construction support services within the approved project budget.
