

Extreme Weather Thresholds

- Heat Awareness Alert Phase 1
 - 95° Coastal or
 - 100° Inland for 3+ days in 5+ Orange County cities.
- Heat Awareness Alert Phase 2
 - 100° Coastal or
 - 105° Inland for 3+ days in 5+ Orange County cities.
- Heat Awareness Alert Phase 3
 - 100° Coastal or
 - 105° Inland for 3+ days in 5+ Orange County cities or
 - Heat index above 110° for any period.
