SUBJECT: AMENDMENT NUMBER TWO TO AGREEMENT WITH MAINTENANCE SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH SWEEPING CORPORATION OF AMERICA FOR STREET SWEEPING SERVICES

SUMMARY

Staff requests City Council approve Amendment No. 2 (Attachment 1) to the contract with Sweeping Corporation of America (SCA) for Street Sweeping services, extending the current agreement by one year to June 30, 2027.

PROPOSED MOTION

Authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute and administer Amendment No. 2 to the Maintenance Services Agreement with SCA for Street Sweeping Services to extend the agreement by one additional year to June 30, 2027, in a form approved by the City Attorney.

FISCAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2026-27 Proposed Budget includes sufficient funding in the Street Cleaning Program supported by the Sanitation Fund (Fund 23). The amendment for SCA street sweeping services totals \$755,400 for FY 2026-27.

DISCUSSION

The City of Fullerton entered into a Maintenance Services Agreement with SCA, formerly operating as CleanStreet, on June 18, 2019 to provide Citywide street sweeping services. The agreement included a five-year base term, with options for two additional one-year extensions. The City is in the final year of the second extension period in FY 2025-26 which expires on June 30, 2026.

City Council approved implementing a biweekly, alternating street sweeping schedule on August 6, 2024. This operational change requires routing, staffing and equipment deployment updates. Staff does not expect full transition to the new schedule until late 2026. Amendment No. 2 would extend the SCA contract for one additional fiscal year, through June 30, 2027, to maintain uninterrupted service as the City transitions to the new sweeping operation

The proposed Amendment No. 2 and extension provides operational flexibility should the City enter into an agreement with a new vendor following the transition, ensuring continuity of service if a change in providers occurs. In addition, the extension allows staff sufficient time to prepare and issue a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a new long-term Street Sweeping Maintenance Services Agreement post-transition which will require coordination, updated specifications development, proposal solicitation, evaluation and award. Staff plans to conduct the RFP in FY 2026-27.
