**SUBJECT:** \$239,992.38 CONTRACT WITH GOLDEN COAST  
CONSTRUCTION FOR CURB AND GUTTER / SIDEWALK  
PROJECT FISCAL YEAR 2024-26

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### SUMMARY

Award \$239,992.38 construction contract to Golden Coast Construction for the Curb and Gutter / Sidewalk Project Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-26.

### PROPOSED MOTION

1. Approve Curb and Gutter / Sidewalk Project FY 2024-26 plans and specifications.
2. Award \$239,992.38 construction contract for Curb and Gutter / Sidewalk Project FY 2024-26 to Golden Coast Construction and authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute and administer the contract, in a form approved by the City Attorney.
3. Authorize Public Works Director, or designee, to approve change orders for construction and professional engineering construction support services within the approved project budget.

#### FISCAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 2025-26 Adopted Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget has sufficient funding for Project 44797 Curb and Gutter / Sidewalk Project FY 2024-26 provided from Measure M2 funds within the Capital Projects Fund (Fund 74).

Staff attached a budget Data Sheet / Summary of Bids and the Contractor Bid Schedule for reference (Attachments 1 and 2).

#### BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

Staff programs curb and gutter and sidewalk projects annually to repair damaged curb, gutter and sidewalk at locations throughout the City, identifying project locations through a combination of resident requests, information provided by the Public Works – Maintenance Division and staff field observations. Staff evaluates and prioritizes Identified locations based on severity of damage, public safety considerations and potential liability exposure. Staff coordinates repair work with other street rehabilitation capital improvement projects and planned private utility work to minimize conflicts and improve construction efficiency. The project for this year covers eighty locations.

The City received nineteen bids on January 29, 2026. Golden Coast Construction of La Habra submitted the lowest responsible base bid totaling \$239,992.38. Staff reviewed the bid and found it acceptable.

Construction would tentatively start March 2026 with anticipated project completion in June 2026. The contractor would notify impacted residents and upcoming construction activities and potential impacts.

Staff prepared an environmental assessment in accordance with California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines and determined that the project is categorically exempt.
