- Growing recreational misuse of Nitrous Oxide, an odorless, colorless gas commonly used as a medical anesthetic.
 - Aka: NOX, laughing gas, or whippets.
- Existing State law leaves loopholes.
- Establish local regulation to prohibit unlawful sale/distribution.
- Align Fullerton with other Orange County cities' regulations on Nitrous Oxide.



Background Data

- Steady increase of incidents associated to Nitrous Oxide from 2020-2025
- Arrests associated with Nitrous Oxide offenses increased by 328%.
- 700% increase in Nitrous Oxide involvement in traffic collisions.
- 12 DUIs and 1 suspected overdose with Nitrous Oxide.

Current State Law

- Prohibition of sales to minors (CPC 381c)
- Furnishing with knowledge of intent to use recreationally (CPC 381d)
- Vendors are required to record each transaction (CPC 381e)

Intent of Proposed Ordinance

- Reduce public access to Nitrous Oxide for recreational abuse.
- Decrease health/safety incidents associated to recreational Nitrous Oxide use.
- Closes State law loopholes.
- More tools for local law enforcement intervention.
- Helps protect vulnerable populations.
- Violators are subject to a misdemeanor citation/arrest and up to \$1,000 civil fine.



- If passed, the Fullerton Police Department will follow up with existing vendors to educate them on the new ordinance.
- FPD will create a social media campaign regarding the new ordinance and the risks of the recreational use of Nitrous Oxide.
