REGULAR BUSINESS (Item 3)

3. FERN DRIVE PARK FENCING

Director Curiel gave a brief update on the concern the Fullerton School District has about securing school sites. He explained that the City has shared use agreements for many park sites with the Fullerton School District. Supervisor Clements presented more details of Fullerton School District concerns and announced that Mr. Schlabsz from Fullerton School District was in attendance.

Supervisor Clements displayed aerial view of Fern Drive Park and explained that the border between the school and the park is down the middle of the property, if fenced off there it would interfere with the integrity of uses. He said that it will not take away commonly used field space as there is an access point after school to get into the space, with an additional rolling gate for mowers. The playground will always be open, picnic areas would not be enclosed within the fence line.

Commissioner Lang-McNabb asked about access for after school sports. Supervisor Clements replied that the rolling gates will be opened between 4-5 pm after school sports begin and then locked up for the night.

Director Curiel emphasized that the gates will remain open for general public outside of school hours and during school hours, the ball field gates are locked and opened once school is out.

Vice Chair Cox asked if there was a consideration for privacy slats similar to Pacific Drive Park. Director Curiel responded that Fullerton School District was not in favor of privacy slats for this location.

Commissioner Castañeda was concerned about pedestrians on the sidewalk and asked if staff considered using a natural barrier.

Director Curiel introduced, Mr. Schlabsz, Fullerton School District, Director of Facility Maintenance & Operations. He responded to Mr. Castañeda's question stating a hedge would not provide a security barrier.

Scott Schlabsz said that there have been a few incidents at different schools and parents have been asking Fullerton School District to be responsible and protect the children.

Commissioner Thakur asked who will lock the gates. Supervisor Clements said the Fullerton Rangers will lock it on the weekends, custodians will lock at the end of the day.

Chair Savage wants to understand concerns of neighbors.

Commissioner Lang-McNabb felt it was a sane and reasonable measure that will help, even though it might not solve all problems or stop fears of parents.

Mr. Schlabsz told the commission that the existing fence line will be replaced with new material and the remainder of the school property will be secured with wrought iron soon.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Pete Nordelo – was concerned with the traffic congestion

Christine Truxaw – also had traffic concerns and the opening of gates for access to the school in the morning.

Phil Lamontagne – proposed that a dog park be created at this site.

Melinda Guinaldo, Carhart – was not in favor of the fence, she prefers the property open, as it is.

Marsha Wolfson – she asked if the entire school would be fenced off.

Commissioners commented on 1) obscuring the view for the neighbors, restricting access to the park, they asked for more thought on the fencing, a better configuration of the fence line, requested more community meetings posted on the website and considering a natural barrier along the sidewalk.

- 8755 trees have been pruned
- 375 trees removed
- 122 trees planted
- West Coast Arborist crews completed downtown and civic center pruning. Crews currently working zone 11 (Harbor Boulevard to Raymond Avenue, Orangethorpe Avenue to Commonwealth avenue)
- Arbor Day 2019 will be held at Richman Park on March 16 or March 23 in the event of rain. Informational flyer in the works. Call Phil Kisor for details at 714-738-5345.
- 2. Red Imported Fire Ant and Honey Bee activity data is unavailable for this time period due to maintenance software system transition.

- 3. Landscape Division Crews completed the following projects in the months of December 2018 / January 2019 beyond standard maintenance duties.
 - Weed abatement completed at the Union Pacific easement
 - Volunteer group completed weed abatement on Juanita Cooke Trail north of Hermosa.
 - Staff cleared downed trees and debris generated from 2 fairly significant rain and wind events in December and January.
 - Homeless cleanups
 - Divisional irrigators continued system improvements at Muckenthaler Cultural Center
 - Irrigation mainline repaired at Gilbert Park
 - Lions field irrigation retrofit completed for new retaining walls
 - Trail grading performed at Castlewood trail
 - Chapman Park baseball field dug outs and backstops replaced (new wood)
 - Hillcrest Park sandbagging completed to minimize flooding and channel water away from the fountain area

SUMMARY

Per Council's direction, staff is providing recommended Park Dwelling fees to be assessed on Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs). The Parks and Recreation Commission will review the information related to the study and recommend the appropriate fee reduction for City Council's review and approval.

RECOMMENDATION

Parks and Recreation Commission review and recommend approval of the reduced ADU fees for fiscal year 2018-19 from \$12,020 per dwelling unit to \$3,620 per accessory dwelling unit.

DISCUSSION

Park Dwelling fees are assessed on new residential developments to help offset the impact on parks, trails, recreational facilities and related public amenities. Park Dwelling fees sustain funding to help acquire, improve, renovate and build parks, open space and recreational facilities throughout the City for the benefit of Fullerton's community.

The City Council determined that the need for park facilities increases in proportion to the increase in the number of dwelling units in the City and the associated increase in population. The park dwelling fee formula was adopted in 1995 to determine the amount to be assessed for each new dwelling unit. This formula is used by most cities.

Park Dwelling Fee Formula

(cost/acre for land acquisition + cost/acre for land development)

x parkland to population need x residents per dwelling unit

FY 2018-19 Park Dwelling fee = \$12,020

Per City Council's request, staff has conducted a market study of surrounding cities for developer park impact fees charged for dwellings and ADUs. Fullerton currently charges the same Park Dwelling fee of \$12,020 for regular dwelling units and ADUs.

Most cities charge per dwelling. Some cities calculate their fees based on square footage or value of dwelling. For a fair comparison, only those cities charging a per dwelling unit fee were used in this study. The average park impact fee for the cities associated with this study is \$11,124 per dwelling and \$5,027 per ADU.

The City of Fullerton has 53 parks, approximately 28 miles of trails and 120,000 square feet of park building space. Most of its parks and park facilities are well over 20 years old.

The funding used to keep this infrastructure in a safe and useable condition comes from Park Dwelling fees. With a nearly built-out city, the projection of new residential development and availability of Park Dwelling funds is limited. Upon receiving Park Dwelling funds for currently approved developments, only \$2.1 million of uncommitted funds are projected to remain in the Park Dwelling fund balance at the end of the current fiscal year.

A typical neighborhood park improvement could cost approximately \$1.5 million. Larger parks and facilities could cost significantly more. Staff is continuously seeking and applying for grants to supplement available Park Dwelling funds. These grants are highly competitive and usually fund only a portion of a project.

In order to sustain a continuous flow of funding to provide for park related improvements, staff is proposing a reduced fee for ADUs of \$3,620 per unit, which falls in line with the market. The proposed fee is calculated using the Park Dwelling fee formula with the elimination of the cost per acre of land. This takes into consideration that ADUs are built within an existing residential property. Although ADUs will add population, they are typically smaller than a regular dwelling unit and will have a lower impact to the City's park infrastructure.
