ORDINANCE NO. XXXX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FULLERTON, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING FULLERTON MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 2.64 (PURCHASING), SECTION 2.64.090 (EMERGENCY PURCHASES)

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FULLERTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> City Council hereby deletes Section 2.64.090 (Emergency Purchases) of Chapter 2.64 (Purchasing) of the Fullerton Municipal Code in its entirety and replaces with the following:

2.64.090 Emergency purchases.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 2.68.050, the immediate requirements of an item or items necessary for the preservation of life or property shall be deemed an emergency. The City Manager, or designee, may approve such purchases provided staff files a full report of the circumstances of all emergency purchases in excess of fifty thousand dollars with City Council at its next regular meeting.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Any provision of the Fullerton Municipal Code or appendices thereto inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies an no further, is hereby repealed or modified to that extent necessary to effect the provisions of this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> If any section, subsection, phrase or clause of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, phrase or clause thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, phrases or clauses may be declared unconstitutional.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published in the manner required by law. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty days from and after its passage.
