SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2020 URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE (UASI) GRANT AGREEMENT

SUMMARY

Request to approve the FY 2020 Urban Areas Security Initiative agreement and accept grant funding if staff attends any training applicable for grant reimbursement.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Accept FY 2020 UASI grant award and authorize City Manager, or designee, to execute FY 2020 UASI agreement.
2. Appropriate receipt and use of grant award in Fund 32.

PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT

This item matches the following Priority Policy Statements:

FISCAL IMPACT

Grant funding will help offset general fund salary costs of Fullerton Police or Fire personnel involved with the instruction, delivery or attendance of approved UASI courses. Training costs cap at 10% of the overall amount allocated to the County and distributed to all partners as they undertake training. The grant reimburses up to \$3,363.64 in eligible training activity taken by Fullerton Police and Fire personnel.

DISCUSSION

The Fullerton Police and Fire departments partnered in the Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant Program administered by the cities of Santa Ana and Anaheim since its inception in 2009. Grant funds originate from the Department of Homeland Security and Federal Emergency Management Agency, through the Governor's Office of Emergency Services and support first responders' capacity to respond to terrorism acts or threats. The limited funding this year will reimburse for Fullerton Police and Fire personnel costs to attend or provide UASI-approved instruction. Additional benefits for Fullerton provided in the past by other UASI funds include:

- Enhancement of multi-jurisdictional / inter-jurisdictional all-hazards incident planning, response and recovery capabilities with armored vehicle, maintenance of training simulators and regional training and exercise program for law enforcement and fire personnel.
- Enhancement of the Countywide Automated License Plate Reader System mobile units installed on police units as well as trailers and fixed mobile cameras available for checkout.
- Sustainment of Ready OC and "If You See Something, Say Something" preparedness campaigns.
- Sustainment of Orange County Civic Center video surveillance system.
- Sustainment of the Orange County Intelligence Assessment Center (OCIAC) intelligence analysts and Terrorism Liaison Officer (TLO) program.
