Hello, Neal.

Can you please confirm the following information for me regarding the City's ability to hold an all-mail ballot election. First, it is understood that the City does not meet the eligibility requirements to hold an all-mail ballot election under Elections Code Sections 4000 (multiple criteria) and 4004 (we have more than 100,000 residents). Further, we now understand that the Board of Supervisors did not adopt provisions of Section 4005 that would allow the County of Orange, as one of 14 counties, to conduct such an election after January 1, 2018.

Accordingly, if the City Council calls for a special election at this time, the only option is to hold a stand-alone election on the next regularly established election date (per Elections Code Section 1000) of November 5, 2019. Thank you.
