SUBJECT: GRANT AWARD FOR WEST COYOTE HILLS OPEN SPACE ACQUISITION

SUMMARY

The City was awarded a \$40,000 grant from the Henry W. and Ellen R. Warne Family Endowment (Warne) for acquisition of open space in the West Coyote Hills.

RECOMMENDATION

Accept the Warne grant and approve a budget transfer of \$40,000 in grant funds and allocate the funds to the West Coyote Hills Acquisition project 54036.

PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT

FISCAL IMPACT

Increase in one-time only dedicated revenue of \$40,000.

DISCUSSION

The City of Fullerton was awarded an additional grant of \$40,000 for the acquisition of Neighborhoods 1 and 3 of the Chevron / Pacific Coast Homes development project in West Coyote Hills from the Henry W. and Ellen R. Warne Family Endowment. The total amount awarded from the Warne endowment is \$140,000. In total, the City has been awarded \$28.2 million in grant funding for acquisition of open space in the West Coyote Hills. The City is working with its external legal counsel and Chevron / PCH to bring forward a purchase and sale agreement for City Council consideration at potentially the July 16, 2019 City Council meeting.
