### **SUMMARY**

Submit project list (previously authorized and constructed projects) and certify project funding for the Orange County Transportation Authority's (OCTA) 2021 Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) as required.

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-XX – A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FULLERTON, CALIFORNIA, WHICH CERTIFIES THAT THE CITY OF FULLERTON HAS THE RESOURCES TO FUND THE PROJECTS IN THE FEDERAL FISCAL YEARS 2020-21 – 2025-26 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND AFFIRMS ITS COMMITMENT TO IMPLEMENT ALL PROJECTS IN THE PROGRAM

### **PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT**

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

None. The City Council previously approved the funding for these projects. The projects to be submitted to the 2021 OCTA FTIP update have completed construction and are currently in project close out stages with funding reimbursements in progress.

## DISCUSSION

The FTIP is the primary listing of all transportation projects identified in the Regional Transportation Plan prepared by the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG). The FTIP lists projects that receive Federal and / or State funds, are regionally significant or involve non-motorized transportation. The FTIP covers a minimum of four years with updates every two years. OCTA is responsible for coordinating with SCAG for preparation of the FTIP. The City provides information for our projects to OCTA.

The current FTIP cycle is the 2019 FTIP. The City has five active projects listed in the 2019 FTIP:

- Citywide Bicycle and Pedestrian Project
  - Construction of bicycle and pedestrian enhancements at seven locations throughout the City.
- Fullerton Transportation Center Elevators Expansion
  - Construction of new elevators at the Transportation Center.
- Wilshire Avenue Bicycle Boulevard
  - Construction of ten traffic circles and traffic signal to provide bikeway enhancements.
- Raymond Avenue Grade Separation\*
  - Construction of new overcrossing at the BNSF railroad tracks.
- State College Boulevard Grade Separation\*
  - Construction of new overcrossing at the BNSF railroad tracks.

All the projects have completed construction and are open to the public. The projects are in various stages of close out and funding reimbursement. Therefore, OCTA is recommending carry over to the 2021 FTIP.

\*As a note, OCTA has agreed to be the lead agency to close out the two grade separation projects. These projects, while included for informational purposes above and in the attached Resolution No. 2019-XX, will be certified / carried over by OCTA.
