

Request

Resolution of Intention to amend Title 15 (Chapter 15.42 and other associated chapters) of the Fullerton Municipal Code to update definitions, development and operational standards for Emergency Shelters and Multiservice Centers for the homeless and potential modifications to the boundaries of the Emergency Shelter (ES) Overlay Zone

Background



- ES-Overlay zone adopted in 2015 to allow emergency shelters for up to 50-beds by right (150 with CUP)
- To date there have been no emergency shelters created or requests from property owners to add the ES-Overlay designation

- Letter of intent with Illumination Foundation in August

Proposed Amendments

- Chapter 15.42 (Emergency Shelter Overlay Zone)
 - Update Terminology/Definitions: "Multiservice Center" or "Navigation Center" "Wrap-around Services" "Recuperative Care"
- Review Development and Operational Standards
 - Number of beds requirements
 - Parking requirements
 - Waiting and intake area
 - Recuperative care services
 - Support services
 - Criteria for determining appropriate E-S Overlay areas
 - Content of Management and Operations plans
- Analyze potential modifications to E-S Overlay Zone boundaries / areas

Next Steps

- Prepare a draft Ordinance reflecting proposed changes to Title 15
- Study session with the Planning Commission and/or Homelessness Ad-Hoc committee
- Revise and refine based on comments
- Planning Commission public hearing to amend Title 15
- City Council public hearing (1st reading)
- Ordinance will go into effect 30days after a 2nd reading by the City Council



Recommended Action

- Adopt Resolution No. 2019-XX declaring the City's intention to amend Title 15 of the Fullerton Municipal Code pertaining to emergency shelters and multiservice centers for the homeless
- Provide initial policy direction on Emergency Shelter / Multiservice Centers for the homeless code amendments

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
