

Purchase and Sale Agreement



- Purchase price:
 - Neighborhood 1 \$7.8 million,
 Neighborhood 3 \$10.275 million
 - Price determined by Federal Yellow Book Appraisal completed on July 8, 2019

- Escrow will be opened with \$100,000 in grant funding from the Warne Family Foundation grant.
- All open space will be owned by the City in fee with deed restriction protecting the property as park and open space in perpetuity.
- Chevron is required to complete remediation, construction of improvements, fund conservation easement habitat protection
 - Improvements include: trails, interpretive center and key vistas
- Provide the City with the public benefits approved in VTTM Resolution.
 - \$3.84 million maintenance grant
 - Fire brush truck
 - Grants for Library and Laguna Lake Park
 - Re-alignment of adjacent existing trails

Acquisition & Open Space Benefits



- Acquire an additional 24.1 acres of land for a total of 397.8 acres
- Preserve a total of 397.8 acres of land including Ward Nature Preserve
- Provide natural recreation without disturbing the habitat
- Protect and restore urban watershed health, improve watershed storage and greenhouse gas reduction

- On-site Interpretive Center
- Provide environmental education and stewardship
- Protect and restore endangered ecosystems including wildlife corridors




