**SUBJECT:** HILLCREST PARK PARKING IMPROVEMENTS

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### **SUMMARY**

Per City Council direction, Staff proposes making minor parking improvements throughout Hillcrest Park to increase the number of parking spaces. With recent park improvements and an increase in park users, the demand for parking has increased.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Approve recommendations from Staff for minor parking adjustments within Hillcrest Park to yield an increase of 21 parking spaces.

### **PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT**

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The estimated cost to for the proposed improvements of \$2,800 will be absorbed in the Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget.

### **DISCUSSION**

Hillcrest Park draws many users to enjoy its unique character and amenities. With its most recent improvements, the number of visitors has increased, making it a challenge to find parking within the park. Recently, Staff, including from traffic engineering and Public Works visited the park to do an on-site analysis of the current parking and to assess opportunities for increasing the number of parking spaces within the park.

Staff focused on opportunities that could be implemented as minor improvements where minimal paving and striping would be required. There are a total of eight areas within the park that could be modified to increase parking capacity, anywhere from two to seven spaces, based on site conditions. In total, these minor improvements would yield an extra 21 spaces, increasing the current count from 148 to 169. These improvements will be done with City crews and will be phased over several weeks.

With the City Council's direction, Staff from Parks and Recreation will move forward and coordinate these improvements with Public Works.
