### **SUMMARY**

The Police Department requests City Council acceptance of \$12,000 2019 Proposition 69 allocation from County of Orange for DNA forensic collection equipment.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Accept 2019 Proposition 69 funds and increase Police Department General Fund appropriation by \$12,000.

### **PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT**

This item matches the following Priority Policy Statement:

- Fiscal and Organizational Stability
- Public Safety.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The Proposition 69 allocation of \$12,000 will enable the Police Department to purchase critical DNA collection equipment without impacting the General Fund budget.

### **DISCUSSION**

The Fullerton Police Department has been awarded funding in the amount of \$12,000 from the County of Orange through the Prop 69 DNA Fingerprint, Unsolved Crime and Innocence Protection Act of 2004 to pay for DNA forensic collection equipment including a CrimeCam Examiner and a Rugged Remote Area Lighting System.

The funding was approved by the Orange County Board of Supervisors on January 28, 2020 (see attachment) and will enable the Police Department's CSI staff to better identify, collect and analyze crime scene evidence using the latest scientific methods.
