- Recommends specific actions to proactively decrease threats
- Updates 2011 LHMP

Local Hazard Mitigation Plan

Hazards Analyzed:

- Seismic Hazards
- Fire (Urban/Wildland)
- Drought
- Severe Weather (Heat, Wind, Rain)
- Dam Failure
- Human-Caused Hazards (Aircraft, Civil Disturbance, Transportation Accidents, Terrorism, Cyber)
- Geologic Hazards (Landslide/Mudflows, Subsidence)
- Flooding
- Hazardous Materials Release
- Disease/Pests

Process:

- May 2018 – Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee
- October 2018 – Public Input Meeting
- March 2019 – Public Review Draft
- May 2019 – Submitted to and approved by California Office of Emergency Services
- June 2019 – Submitted to and approved by FEMA

Recommended Action

- Adopt Resolution No. 2020-XX:
 - Exempts pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15061(b)(3)
 - Adopts the Fullerton LHMP as approved by FEMA on June 10, 2019
 - Adopts corresponding revisions to The Fullerton Plan, including a comprehensive update to Appendix I, thereby adopting the LHMP into the safety element of the City's general plan pursuant to government code section 65302.6
