- The President signed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act making available \$5 billion in supplemental CDBG funding
- City of Fullerton will receive \$819,487 CDBG CV Funding
- Funding is for prevention, preparing for, and responding to COVID-19
- To receive the CDBG CV funds, the City has to prepare a Substantial Amendment to the 2019-20 Annual Action Plan and revised the Citizen Participation Plan



Jobs 1st Small Business Loan Programs

- Working with Small Business Development Center (SBDC), the City will create two loan programs up to \$25,000:
 - Micro Enterprise Loans Businesses 1 to 5 employees with the owner being one of the employees
 - Small Loan Program Businesses with less than 100 employees
- If approved, an Application Portal will be on the City's website starting in June
- Webinars will be conducted
- Loans are deferred up to one year and could be forgiven if the employees are retained.



Jobs 1st Small Business Loan Programs - Criteria for Eligibility

- Cannot have received the EIDL/PPP loans
- Types of businesses
 - Sales-tax generating/Industrial Businesses
 - Physical commercial location in the City of Fullerton for 1 year minimum
 - No Home Occupations/No Franchises
 - No service based (property management, insurance, realtors, etc.)
- Current business license/open prior to COVID-19
- Impacted by COVID-19
 - Closure due to non-essential business
 - Loss of 25% or more in revenue demonstrating a close tie between revenue loss and initiation of stay-home order.
 - Loss of employees due to contracting COVID-19



Homeless Prevention

- Pathways of Hope Fullerton Interfaith Emergency Service
- Rental/Utility and Food Assistance to families at 30 to 50% of AMI
- Approximately 40 households will be assisted
- Assistance for up to 3 months
- Will provide case management services



- Parks and Recreation Senior Services will develop a voucher system with local restaurants for seniors and low income residents
- Eligible Clients will be able to receive two meals per day from local restaurants
- Clients cannot be receiving assistance from other food programs
- Local non-profits and churches can refer clients to the program
