SERVICES OFFICE ON AGING AGREEMENTS FOR

FUNDING OF OLDER ADULT PROGRAMS

SUMMARY

Resolution authorizing the City Manager or designee to sign all documents pertaining to the grant awards from the County of Orange Community Services Office on Aging to provide older adult programs grant-funding offered at the Fullerton Community Center. Additionally to accept future additional one-time-only funds associated with County of Orange Community Services Office on Aging agreements and receive \$43,255 award under the Contract for Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, H.R. 748 – Community Services for older adult services to be carried out in Fiscal Years 2020-2021 and 2021-22.

RECOMMENDATION

- Authorize City Manager, or designee, to sign documents pertaining to grant awards from County of Orange Community Services Office on Aging to provide older adult services grant-funding.
- 2. Accept grant awards for both Fiscal Years 2020-21 and 2021-22 and appropriate receipt and uses of FY 2020-21 grant award for \$34,120.

PRIORITY POLICY STATEMENT

FISCAL IMPACT

The City will receive \$43,255 in County funds under the CARES contract. The City will receive \$34,120 in FY 2020-21 and \$9,135 which to incorporate in the FY 2021-22 budget.

DISCUSSION

The City has received Older Americans Act Title III-B funding for the purpose of providing recreation, wellness and social service programs to the City's older adults since the 1970's. These programs and services, offered at the Fullerton Community Center, provide older adults the opportunity to engage in organized enriching activities that promote health, vitality and well-being. The additional funding for will serve approximately 4,500 seniors with programs, material aid (government surplus commodities and Senior Grocery Program) and outreach.

The Title III-B Older Americans Act and CARES H.R. 748 Community Services funding is administered by the County of Orange Community Services Office on Aging. The County's policy requires that each agency receiving these grant funds designate by resolution an authorized signer.
